

### **DIRECTOR'S NOTES**



The Drowsy Chaperone began when Don McKellar, Lisa Lambert, and Greg Morrison created a parody of old-fashioned musicals for a stag party honoring their friends, Bob Martin and Janet Van De Graaff. Bob, who ended up co-writing and originating the role of Man in Chair, explains its next phase of production: "We decided to take the material and create a show and put it on at the Fringe Festival in Toronto and that was the first staging of it. It was a big hit with the Toronto theatre community and grew from there. We were all reacting against a type of musical that was very popular at that time: overblown, content-oriented musicals like Miss Sainty or Lee Missenthes We missed the way you could connect with a

Saigon or Les Misérables. We missed the way you could connect with a performer like Fred Astaire, who entertained you in a very pure way. We decided to create a show that was a love letter to that type of performance."

Nine years and many versions later, the forty-minute spoof became what we now know as *The Drowsy Chaperone*. Although its origins are atypical, and despite the fact that it was not a revival, not based on a play, nor inspired by a movie, the musical opened on Broadway in May 2006 and went on to score thirteen Tony nominations and five wins (Best Book of a Musical, Best Score, Best Scenic Design, Best Costume Design, and Best Featured Actress in a Musical for Beth Leavel).

Packed full of gimmicks, clichés, and gags, *The Drowsy Chaperone* is an homage, a valentine if you will, that captures the spirit of the carefree age of the 1920s by celebrating Gershwin-era musicals as well as the restorative powers of theatre. As laughter is often a reflection of our culture and the times in which we live, the musical theatre explosion of the 1920s was an antidote to the dreariness of World War I, when audiences flocked to the theatre for spectacle, looking to escape the reality of their daily lives into a world replete with larger-than-life characters, toe-tapping melodies, and happily ever. This ability to not take things too seriously, to look at life and art with a sense of humor, continues to be relevant today and I find such frivolity important to not only nurture in ourselves but in the audiences of tomorrow.

In order for a show to truly resonate, however, it should provide more than a good time. As a director, I am drawn to *The Drowsy Chaperone* because, at its core, it has heart as is evident in the emotional journey of its narrator, Man in Chair. In addition, his infectious love of musicals speaks to anyone who has ever been transported by the theatre which is why the creative team, cast, crew, and I aspired to successfully interpret the show the way in which he envisions it.

In closing, I am incredibly excited to introduce *The Drowsy Chaperone* to those of you not familiar with the title as well as to offer those of you who share my fondness for it our take on what I find to be a special little show. I cannot think of a more fitting place to present a story about one's love of musicals than here in the Marian Gallaway Theatre, on a stage with a rich history of bringing classic musicals to life.


