Special Note: The original ballet, Paquita, was choreographed by Joseph Mazilier and premiered in Paris in 1846. As the costumes and choreography suggest, the ballet takes place in Spain. In 1881, the ballet was revived in Russia by French dancer/choreographer, Marius Petipa. Petipa added a Grand Pas Classique to the final act with additional music by Ludwig Minkus. This pas de deux with ensemble became a favorite with the audience and took on its own life. The Grand Pas Classique from the full-length ballet is performed by most major ballet companies in the world. This production is based on the Petipa/Kirov version as performed by the repetiteur in 1994.
