Stacy Alley (Director) is the Director of Musical Theatre at The University of Alabama (UA) as well as a professional director and choreographer whose recent credits include work at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival in Scotland, the Festival Internacional de Teatro y Danza in Chile, Forestburgh Playhouse in NY, and the Oklahoma Shakespearean Festival. She was in the inaugural SummerTide production of *Pump Boys and Dinettes* and since has directed/choreographed *Smoke*

on the Mountain, The Marvelous Wonderettes, Ring of Fire and All Shook Up as well as choreographed Smokey Joe's Café, Jubilee, Dames at Sea, and Anything Goes. UA directing/choreography credits include August: Osage County, A Chorus Line, Young Frankenstein, 42nd Street, Urinetown, and Chicago as well as pieces in Alabama Repertory Dance Theatre concerts. Stacy has been performing professionally for thirty years, including five years as a featured dancer in Radio City Music Hall's Christmas Spectacular. She is a member of the Screen Actors Guild-American Federation of Television and Radio Artists, the Southeastern Theatre Conference, the Society of Stage Directors and Choreographers, the Alabama Conference of Theatre, and is the Vice-President for the Musical Theatre Educators Alliance. F. Randy deCelle (Production Manager) As Associate Professor, Technical Director, and Electrical Engineer specializing in entertainment technology and automation. Randy teaches graduate and undergraduate courses in traditional and technology based topics within entertainment production. He serves as a production advisor for the department, mentoring graduate and undergraduate students training for careers in theatre production. He also serves as Director of Graduate

Studies for the department. Recent Departmental production work includes serving as Technical Director on August: Osage County, The Philadelphia Story, Hamlet and The Countess of Storyville. Recent professional work includes serving as Technical Designer for visual artist, choreographer, and National Medal of Arts recipient Ralph Lemon's 2016 Bessie Award winning Scaffold Room. He is an active member of USITT and SETC, is a member of the Editorial Board for Southern Theatre Magazine and serves as the Editor for the Outside the Box series for the publication.



Andy Fitch (Scenic Designer) has been working as a professional scenic designer and educator since 1991. In the early part of his career Andy worked extensively in corporate special events, designing dozens of commercial events for ShowCo in Dallas. Since 1996 Andy has led the MFA concentration in Scenic Design at The University of Alabama. Some favorite designs throughout his career include: The Color Purple, Legally Blonde, Hairspray, The Drowsy Chaperone, The Producers, The Sound of Music,

The Drawer Boy, Betrayal, The Grapes of Wrath, Cinderella, Beauty and the Beast and Forever Plaid. Andy is a founding member of the acclaimed Kitchen Dog Theatre in Dallas where he won the Rabin award (Dallas) for his scenic design for Fool for Love. Andy's training includes an MFA from Southern Methodist University in Dallas where he studied with noted stage designers William and Jean Eckart.



William Gantt (Assistant Business Manager) received his Juris Doctor and BA degree in Advertising from The University of Alabama. While practicing law in Birmingham, the Demopolis native served on the Board of Directors for Birmingham Festival Theatre where he produced Doug Wright's I Am My Own Wife and Intimate Apparel by Lynn Nottage. He has participated in grant review panels for the Alabama State Council on the Arts and recently organized a statewide concert tour by New York pianist John Davis with the Council's support.

His area of specialty is entertainment technology,
specifically lighting, audio and computer assisted design
(CAD). He has worked extensively in outdoor drama,
television, film and special event production as well
as legitimate theatre and dance. He has lit UA Theatre
and Dance performances at the Kennedy Center in

Washington, as well as the Biennial Dance Festival at the Universite de Lumiere in Lyons, France. He co-designed and served as technical director for Martha's Sewing Room, one of the longest running and most viewed shows on Alabama Public Television. Professor Teague is also active in regional and national theatre organizations, serving on the executive board of the United States Institute for Theatre Technology (USITT) for eight years. He received the Alabama National Alumni Association's 2004 "Outstanding Commitment to Teaching Award", and in 1996, was named "Design and Technology Educator of the Year" by USITT.



Dominic M. Yeager (Business Manager) is an Assistant Professor of Arts Management and heads the Arts Management program at The University of Alabama. In addition, he serves as Business and Operations Manager for the Department. He has had the opportunity to work for non-profit organizations, municipalities and corporations throughout the Unites States. Recently, Dominic worked as the Production Manager on the award-winning feature film "Service"

to Man" and he is currently working as the General Manager for the Off-Broadway production Separate and Equal.
